

# SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

## DEFINITION

Social development refers to the process by which individuals learn and internalize the values, skills, and behaviors necessary to interact effectively with others. It encompasses understanding social norms, building relationships, and managing emotions in social contexts. This growth is continuous, starting in childhood and progressing throughout life.

## EXAMPLES

- **Sharing Toys:** A child learns the importance of sharing toys with peers, understanding the concepts of fairness and cooperation.
- **Learning Empathy:** An individual comforts a friend who is upset, demonstrating their ability to understand and respond to the emotions of others.
