architecture and construction was according to Ai Weiwei based on the baskets that his wife Lu Qing buys from local antiques markets in Beijing. It is a stunning achievement. Once seen, never forgotten. There have been many spectacular venues for the Olympics over the years, but few if any stadia can live longer in the memory than the Birds Nest. Birds Nest was a name reportedly given to the stadium by local people who watched it being built in their midst. On Freedom of Expression: Say what you need to say plainly and then take responsibility for it. A small act is worth a million thoughts. Liberty is about our rights to question everything.

On Art and Activism: Everything is art. Everything is politics. The art always wins. Anything can happen to me, but the art will stay. Life is art. Art is life. I never separate it. I don't feel that much anger. I equally have a lot of joy.

On Government Power and Making Moral Choice: Once you've tasted freedom, it stays in your heart, and no one can take it. Then you can be more powerful than a whole country. I feel powerless all the time, but I regain my energy by making a very small difference that won't cost me much. Tips on surviving the regime: Respect yourself and speak for others. Personal Reflection: I've never planned any part of my career except being an artist. And I was pushed into that corner because I thought being an artist was the only way to have a little freedom. Anyone fighting for freedom does not want to totally lose their freedom. Expressing oneself is like a drug. I'm so addicted to it.
